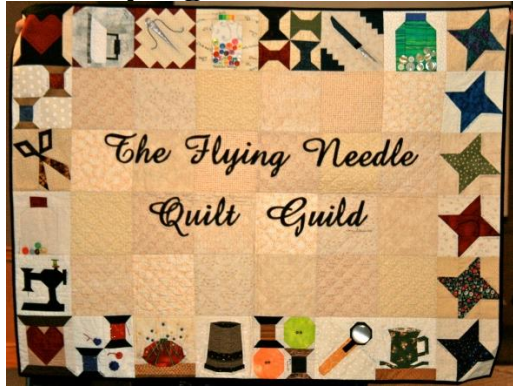


The Flying Needle Quilt Guild 2021-2022
